What is PGA Junior League Golf? PGA Junior League is a program designed to introduce boys and girls, ages 13 and under, to the game of golf in a fun, social, and inclusive environment. The program allows young golfers to learn the game from experienced PGA professionals. It emphasizes teamwork and enjoyment, much like other recreational youth sports. Participants wear numbered jerseys, forming teams that play together, making it a community-oriented activity that encourages friendship and team spirit.

How It Works: The game structure is built around a team format where players are divided into two-person pairs. These pairs work together throughout the course of the match, supporting each other, and learning the value of collaboration. The format promotes both skill development and social interaction.

Key Features of the Game:

1. Two-Person Scramble Format:

All games in the PGA Jr. League are played using a two-person scramble format, which significantly impacts how the game is played:

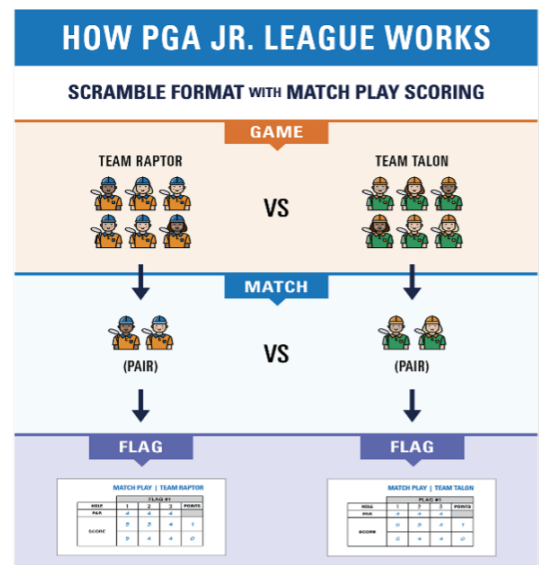
- Both players in a pair hit their drives.
- The team then selects the better of the two drives.
- From that selected location, both players hit their next shots, and the process repeats itself until the ball is holed.

The scramble format allows each player to contribute and improves the overall team experience. It reduces the pressure on individual performance, making the game more enjoyable and accessible for young players of various skill levels.

2. Match Play Scoring:

Unlike traditional golf, which is typically scored by strokes (the number of strokes it takes to complete the course), PGA Jr. League uses match play scoring. In match play:

- Each hole is a separate contest between the two teams, where the team that completes the hole in the fewest strokes wins the hole.
- The overall winner of the match is determined by who wins the most holes, not by the total number of strokes.
- This format is designed to make the game more engaging for young players, as it focuses on head-to-head competition rather than comparing total scores across a round.





3. 9-Hole Matches Broken into Flags:

Each PGA Jr. League match consists of 9 holes, but to make the game more manageable and fun, the 9-hole match is divided into three flags. Each flag consists of three consecutive holes. After completing each flag, the teams have the opportunity to earn points, with the goal of earning the most flags.

- Flags break the match into smaller segments, making it easier for young players to focus on manageable portions of the game.
- Points are awarded based on performance within each flag. This adds a layer of excitement as teams strive to win each flag during the match.

4. Team Spirit and Sportsmanship:

Just like other team sports, PGA Junior League encourages camaraderie, sportsmanship, and teamwork. Players are motivated to work together, helping each other improve their game. This collaborative approach not only makes golf more accessible but also builds life skills such as communication and cooperation.

Why PGA Junior League? PGA Junior League Golf offers a fantastic opportunity for young players to develop their skills in a supportive, team-oriented environment. With a focus on fun, learning, and social interaction, it helps children experience the joys of golf while building important life skills along the way.

KEEPER OF THE GREENS



I am sure many of you have noticed the daylight is getting longer every day and it's still light out after 5:00 pm. This is a nice feeling knowing that spring and summer are getting closer. The turf department is moving along nicely on our winter projects list.

Over the past month the turf department has been keeping busy by brush cutting all of the forced carries on the course and continued working on the required pond maintenance for both the city of Sammamish and King County. This involves cutting and/or removing trees, blackberries, and other brush that are growing on the pond banks to ensure we stay within the city's and county's standards for these storm water systems.

We have also started to work on fixing drainage on bunkers that typically hold water after rain events. This process involves removing the bunker sand and pea gravel to expose the drainage pipe, and flushing out the drainage pipe to ensure there are no blockages in the pipe to allow for maximum water infiltration and flow. Once these steps are completed, we will bury the pipe with new pea gravel and sand and smooth out the bunker bottom. This project will allow the water to percolate through the sand and pea gravel faster after rain to make these bunkers more playable for everyone.

During the month of February, we are planning to weed and add new mulch to the landscape beds in the parking lot and around the rec center and clubhouse. We will also, continue with pruning trees around the golf course to help make some of those golf shots a little bit easier for everyone to execute while playing.

Even in the winter chill, the pool remains warm and inviting!

- Open Swim: Saturdays and Sundays from 12:00 PM to 4:00 PM.
- Morning Lap Swim: Continues weekly, except for Saturday mornings.
- Weekend Lap Swim: Available during open swim times.

Temperature Reminder: The pool is heated to a comfortable 84 degrees. Please remember to take a quick cleansing shower before entering the water to help us maintain a clean and healthy pool environment for everyone.

DRESS CODE

GOLF COURSE/PRACTICE FACILITY

Acceptable attire for men and male children 5 and older:

- Collared shirts with sleeves or golf course appropriate mock neck shirts, jackets & pullovers
- Golf appropriate slacks. Golf appropriate shorts no shorter than 4" above the knee
- Golf appropriate rain gear

Acceptable attire for women and female children 5 years and older:

- Sleeved and sleeveless tops with collars or golf course appropriate mock neck shirts, pullovers, and jackets
- Golf appropriate dresses, skirts, and shorts no shorter than 4" above the knee
- Golf appropriate slacks
- Golf appropriate rain gear

NOT acceptable attire for all members, guests, and children: No sweatpants, tracksuits, workout attire, tank tops, bathing suits, athletic shorts or shirts, tee shirts, or hats worn backwards.

CLUBHOUSE*

Acceptable attire for men, women, and children 5 and older:

- Collared shirts with sleeves or golf course appropriate mock neck shirts, jackets & pullovers
- Golf appropriate slacks. Golf appropriate shorts no shorter than 4" above the knee
- (Women) Sleeved and sleeveless tops with collars or golf course appropriate mock neck shirts, pullovers, and jackets
- (Women) Golf dresses, skirts, and shorts no shorter than 4" above the knee.
- Denim pants are free of rips and/or tears

NOT acceptable attire for all members, guests, and children: No sweatpants, tracksuits, workout attire, tank tops, bathing suits, athletic shorts or shirts, tee shirts, or hats worn backwards.

*some club events may have specific attire guidelines. Members will be informed of these as they occur.

FITNESS FACILITY

Appropriate workout attire is acceptable in the fitness facility. Shoes must be worn at all times.

SWIMMING POOL

Swim attire is strictly limited to the pool deck and locker rooms.

RECREATION CENTER CLUBHOUSE

All clubhouse, fitness facility, and golf course attire are acceptable in the Recreation Center Clubhouse. Shoes must be worn at all times.

Appropriate tennis attire must be worn at all times.
